

Harf of Jarr — Introduction and the Preposition Min

A gentle reminder: these model answers are for checking, not studying. Reading them before attempting the quiz is futile — nothing is learnt that way. Attempt the full quiz from memory first; the struggle to recall is where the learning happens. Then return here and mark your own work honestly.

- False** — the two elements of the murakkab jarri are always adjacent — and the ism after a harf of jarr is ALWAYS in jarr, no exceptions.
- True** — 3,226 occurrences — and 11 of the 17 haroof of jarr appear in the Quran.
- False** — detached pronouns are always rafa' and can never follow a harf of jarr — use the attached pronoun: مِنْهُ.
- b) A helping fatha** — the sukoon of مَنْ would clash with the sukoon of hamzat al-wasl — the same phonetic rule seen with هُمْ and هَلِ.
- a) and c)** — إِبْرَاهِيمُ is ghayru munsarif — fatha in jarr, never kasra; the sound masculine plural takes يْنَ in jarr, never تُونَ.
- مِنَّا · مِنِّي · مِنْكُمْ · مِنْهَا.
- مِنْ الْكِتَابَيْنِ — dual تَانِ becomes يْنَ in jarr · مِنْ آيَاتِ — SFP تَاتُ becomes تَاتِ.
- مِنْ النَّاسِ — harf مِنْ with helping fatha, النَّاسِ majruur · بِاللَّهِ — harf بِ, اللَّهِ majruur. One rule, all eleven Quranic haroof.
- مِنْ (harf of jarr) + attached pronoun هُمْ (them) = "among them" — a murakkab jarri whose ism is an attached pronoun in jarr, exactly the drilled template.
- The murakkab jarri appears ~13,000 times in the Quran — at least once on virtually every line of the mushaf. Master it and you recognise something on every line you read.
